*The Department of Health requires us to hold a public forum every six years to establish water use goals. Our current water use goal is: "Maintain average use per home of 134 gallons per day or less through 2018." Our actual usage per home has been 111 gallons per day (gpd), which is clearly below our goal of 134 gpd. The board is recommending our goal be 122 gpd or less through 2024.

Water Assessment. As we mentioned in the last newsletters, we have hired an engineer to assess our water system. The initial report indicates our well can provide water to all remaining vacant lots. It has been recommended that we only add five (5) water connections/year. All vacant lot owners will receive a letter in the coming weeks about participating in the lottery system at this year's annual meeting. A water connection currently costs \$10,000.
